Former FICOM board member receives CPABC lifetime achievement award

Statement from Frank Chong, acting Superintendent of Financial Institutions at FICOM:

I'm pleased to announce that former Financial Institutions Commission board member Len Boggio has received a lifetime achievement award from the Chartered Professional Accountants of British Columbia.

Len joined us at FICOM in 2012 and served as a board member until his retirement in 2018. He brought with him over 30 years of experience with PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) where he worked with financial services companies in the banking, credit union, trust company, and life insurance sectors in British Columbia. The citation from CPABC says in part:

"The Lifetime Achievement Award recognizes the exceptional dedication, commitment, and extraordinary contributions of those members who have received their Fellowship and since then have continued to attain significant achievements in a broad range of areas.

A sought-after advisor and director of a number of public and private companies, Len widely shares his considerable financial, business, and industry experience. He is currently an independent director and Audit Committee chair of BC Hydro, where he exercises a governance role over some of the organization's most complex and important projects, including Site C and the recent purchase of the Waneta Dam. He also serves as an independent director and advisor to several public mining companies and has been a commissioner of the Financial Institutions Commission, the provincial regulatory agency that safeguards the stability and reputation of BC's financial sector.

Len obtained his designation in 1985 in BC and was elected to fellowship in 2007. A respected educator, Len taught the audit component of the Institute of Corporate Directors program and has lectured at SFU and the Law Society of BC. He is also an active volunteer, and has advocated for children with dyslexia and other learning disabilities through his service with the Kenneth Gordon Maplewood School and related Foundation.
